Mr. David Perkey has worked with the Field Data Collection and Analysis Branch of the Coastal and Hydraulics Laboratory since July of 2008. His research focusses on sediment properties and processes, specifically describing the erosion and transport processes and geochemical composition of cohesive sediments in marine, estuarine, and fluvial environments.



Prior to his current position, David worked at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science at the College of William and Mary in Gloucester Point, VA. There he managed the Radio Carbon-Organic Geochemistry Laboratory from 2004-2006 and the Coastal Processes/Coastal Morphology Laboratory from 2006-2008. Mr. Perkey graduated from the University of South Carolina with a bachelor's degree in marine science, and obtained a master's degree in earth science from North Carolina State University. He is currently working on his PhD in oceanography at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science at the College of William and Mary through the ERDC long term training program.
