Before beginning his employment with the Corps of Engineers in 1977, Mr. Joseph Wilson performed research in deep-sea oceanography at the University of North Carolina Marine Bio-Medical Research Center. His Corps experience has spanned four Corps districts (Wilmington, Charleston, Mobile, and Sacramento) and the Water Resources Support Center at Ft. Belvoir, VA. He has worked in regulatory, planning, operations and military programs and has extensive experience writing and reviewing environmental regulations. In addition, Mr. Wilson has served as a guest lecturer at GW University graduate law school. As a senior environmental policy writer with the Operations Division in the Directorate of Civil Works, he is responsible for oversight and policy development for the environmental aspects of the Corps' dredging program and is the author of the 1988 O&M dredging regulation as well as numerous other policies on ocean dumping, endangered species, coastal zone consistency and many others. He serves as headquarters program monitor for the Aquatic Nuisance Research Program, Dredging Operations and Environmental Research Program, Dredging Operations Technical Support Program and Water Operations Technical Support Program.
