



- Resource Agency & local concerns that Corps O&M dredging activity is spreading Spartina seeds
- Corps collected 26 grab samples of shoal sediments in the channel adjacent to invasive Spartina beds for lab evaluation.
- No signs of seeds or fragments in samples or germination @ 4 weeks.
